# **PANEL MEETING REVAMP FOR 2025**

The first Area Panel Meeting took place in September 2017 when tenants and staff from Radius came together to discuss various issues of importance.

Since then the panel meetings have continued to go from strength to strength. During the pandemic the meetings moved fully online, thus allowing tenants from across Northern Ireland to take part for the first time, as we all learnt how to use zoom, mute devices and move into break out rooms!

When restrictions were lifted, it was decided to combine our online meetings with our established in-person meeting in the Boardroom in Holywood, in what became known as hybrid panel meetings.

Both staff and tenants can agree that each hybrid panel meeting is different, coming with the unique challenge technology brings, from joining and taking part and sound issues, plus having tenants and staff together in the Boardroom and online at the same time.

As the popularity of these panel meetings has grown, to ensure tenants continue to have a good experience, both online and in person, a working group exercise was set up with our Tenant Executive Committee (TEC) members to discuss the current panel meeting structure, what works well and what could be changed to improve the overall meeting experience.

The TEC agreed the panel meetings are a great opportunity for tenants to hold Radius accountable on key performance issues and want this to continue.



#### **FEEDBACK & ACTIONS**

As a result of this Tenant Working Group feedback, the Tenant Engagement team are going to pilot a number of suggestions as recommended by the TEC, including:

#### **Staff Tenant 1:1**

A member of staff wil be available to help address individual queries/questions both before and after the meeting. This will help the smooth running of the group meeting.

#### **Quarterly Themed Meetings**

Themed panel meetings will be introduced every quarter to discuss in detail Radius Key Performances and focus on one topic.

#### **Separate Meetings**

Separate meetings will be trialled - both an **in-person only** and an **online only** meeting. This will help ensure everyone's involvement and reduce technical issues arising from hybrid meetings.

So with Spring officially here, it's time to get outside, enjoy the better weather, and with that comes a host of jobs to do around the garden.

It's a great time to feed your shrubs to encourage strong growth and help fight pests and disease.

It's not too late to get some **pruning** done but be mindful about what type of plant you are pruning. For helpful information on pruning vist the RHS website.

Many of our tenants and schemes plant and harvest their very own vegetables, which always tastes better than shop bought! Seeds such as peas, broccoli, onions, softneck variety garlic, carrots, parsnips and beetroot can all be sown directly in the ground.



Even try your hand at growing your own potatoes! Just pick up a bag of seed potatoes at any gardening shop, or, if you have a few old potatoes with 'tentacles' growing from them (these are called eyes), plant them in the ground and get ready to harvest in around 12 weeks.

> You can also get salad season started by planting lettuce, radishes and spring onions.
